

We have new opportunities to be actively engaged in our community!

UD Professor Francis Kwansa brings our attention to this serious need:

UD currently has 24,221 enrolled students of whom **4,449 are graduate students**. About **39% of the graduate students** (approx. 1780) are international students from about 89 countries including: China, India, S. Korea, Central and South America, and

several African and Caribbean countries.

UD's stipend of \$22,660 translates to \$1,888 per month for 12 months – which after paying for rent, utilities and childcare (for those with families) leaves very little to cover food expenses, clothing, and transportation.

The proposed solution: FPC will establish a Food Bank distribution center that will serve the UD International Graduate Student community and *any others* in the Newark area experiencing food insecurity. Delaware Food Bank's mission is to inspire hope in our communities by providing food to nourish Delawareans, while collaborating on long-term solutions to hunger and poverty.

Would you be willing to help implement this exciting opportunity right here in Memorial Hall? Please contact a member of our team if you are interested in the entire project and/or you would like to volunteer for a specific role.

_____The Coordinator/Manager/Director is responsible for the overall management and organization of the Food Pantry Program, working closely with an Assistant Manager and volunteers. This person is responsible for internal control, schedules and oversees volunteers and publicizes this center and prepares reports for the Food Bank and FPC.

Ordering and Inventory Manager --- Marianne Piser has volunteered! She would love volunteer assistants, who will help keep records which accurately reflect the total amount of food ordered, received and distributed. All products, both perishable and non-perishable, must be used within one month of receipt from the Food Bank.

____2 volunteers for each day we are open – (Every other Mon. & Friday from 4-6 p.m.) to check people in/out and provide radical hospitality (caring curiosity, acceptance, a shared sense of belonging).

_____ ServSafe training -- We just need one person to complete this – which involves 8 hours of classroom and coursework and a proctored exam. It can be completed online. This person will then provide overall guidance for food storage and distribution.

____Governing Board Member (a requirement of the Food Bank) -- provides guidance and overall direction. We think the Governing Board might meet monthly in the beginning, and maybe not so often after everything gets set up and perking along well.

____Suggest names for our Food Bank Distribution Center – that will help convey we are doing more than handing out food – we are helping people thrive. Here are some starters: The Food Oasis, Nourish & Flourish @FPC, please let us know your ideas!

Hello Folks,

I have been asked by an Elder Alain Nsapu from Elkton's partner church in Kananga to help him fund the studies that he needs to complete to get his PhD so that he can remain as a lecturer in economics at the Kananga University. There has been a recent development to upgrade requirements at universities across the Congo. If Alain does not obtain his PhD, who will lose his lecturer position, which is his primary source of income.

I have known Alain since at least 2015 (and maybe 2010) primarily from his work as the Treasurer for the Congolese Presbyterian Church (CPC). I have been impressed during my interactions with him.

There are 2 major Presbyterian denominations in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the CPC (Congolese Presbyterian Church of the Congo) and the CPK (Congolese Presbyterian Church of Kinshasa). The CPC and CPK were originally one denomination but there was a split (power struggles, language- Lingala for CPK & Tshiluba for CPC, and tribal). The CPK is based in Kinshasa, the nation's capital, and the Congo's most populist region. The CPC is based in Kanaga, headed by Pastor Tshidinda, who is from the Kananga Presbytery. Most of the CPC parishes are in the Kasai region but it has a larger geographical spread than the CPK (with parishes also in Kinshasa). PCUSA has relationships with both denominations and engages in projects with both denominations. Joint PCUSA and CPC projects include peacemaking activities that have received funding also from the New Castle Presbytery. There are now more Presbyterians in the Congo than in USA. The Dinanga church, Pastor Tshibuabua's parish, and our partner church, is part of the Kananga Presbytery, which is part of the CPC.

I often send funds from the New Castle Presbytery, intended for the Kananga Presbytery, through the bank account that the CPC has (most people and organizations do not have their own bank account in Kananga). Alain coordinates the fund transfers to the folks in the Kananga Presbytery, while also serving to provide some transparency regarding funding transfers. This week I sent \$5400 from the New Castle Presbytery for the Kananga Presbyterian Women to purchase a rice mill and some

sewing machines through Alain and the CPC account. Of course, Alain, oversees the other financial affairs of the CPC.

Alain said it will cost about \$4000 to complete his studies. This amount of money is multiple years worth of a typical salary in the Congo. This is a one-time activity to assist Alain. He needs the funds by the second half of this July.

We typically do not use church funds for specific people. We have aggregated gifts from church folks acting as individuals to help with medical needs and the education needs of individuals. We do this pretty often such as when we collected for Pastor Eric and for Leia. That is what I am trying to do for Alain.

I am also reaching out to individuals in the Elkton church.

If you are interested, please contact me. I can provide additional details regarding his studies and the cost breakdown. I will provide an accounting of gifts for Alain.
