Lori was diagnosed with cancer in 1995 and died in 2003. Lori's daughter, Sarah,

founded Lori's Hands in her mother's memory during her sophomore year at

the University of Delaware.

• Lori's Hands trains college student volunteers to make weekly visits to community members

living with chronic illnesses. Students help with day-to-day tasks and clients educate students about the human experience of chronic disease.

Nearly 40% of dementia can either be delayed or completely prevented by reducing risk factors and living a brain-healthy lifestyle. Changing health behaviors isn't easy – but it's much easier and more successful if you have your friends and family giving you encouragement and support.

Professor Matthew Cohen, from UD's Brain Wellness Information, Support,

and Empowerment (Brain-WISE) program will lead these **6 workshops which will use the power of group support to help us make a plan to improve and sustain our brain health.** 

The Brain-WISE team wants to be sure this series is accomplishing its goals and that participants are getting the most out of it. They will ask participants:

to complete brief health questionnaires before the program, immediately after the program, and again 3 months later.

to complete brief satisfaction surveys after each session.




### **<u>FPC-N Weather Policy</u> For Inclement weather delays and closings**

The guidelines below cover our policies for cancellations and delays on days when the weather could affect our services and activities.

- 1. When the Christina School District closes, or opens late, our campus will be closed until our parking lots, walks, and entrances are snow and ice free, and the roads are cleared and safe. Check the Church website or contact your group leader for confirmation.
- 2. When the state of Delaware declares a state of emergency and issues a travel ban for New Castle County, our campus will be closed while the travel emergency is in place, and until our parking lots, walks, and entrances are snow and ice free. Check the Church website or contact your group leader for confirmation.
- 3. If the weather conditions are determined to be unsafe to allow Sunday worship service, email notification will be sent to members and a notice will appear on the front page of the church website. *Group Leaders and Directors should keep participants updated during questionable weather.*
