Give Thanks with a Grateful Heart!

Pastor Eric Dear Friends,

November is here, a time of thanksgiving and hope for the future! Our stewardship/commitment campaign will start shortly. We need everyone's support for the church to do the continuing excellent mission, worship, praise, Bible Studies, and pastoral care that we are so good at. Also, we will have that very special day of Thanksgiving when we especially thank God for all that God has done for us. And as November comes to an end Advent will begin. It is a special time of celebration, a time of giving thanks and anticipation of a very beautiful time of the year – Advent and Christmas.

Perhaps one of the greatest things we can learn during this month is how to live life being always thankful! One of the characteristics of many of our Biblical characters is to live thankfully. As all of us do, the folks in the Bible also face life's great challenges. God calls Abraham and Sarah on a remarkable journey that takes them through many lands, great difficulties, and times when they did not know if they would survive, but throughout they were thankful to the Lord. Job's life was nearly destroyed and yet he kept his faith, and at the end of all that he had faced he gave thanks to God.

As Jesus was dying in agony on the cross, he cried: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

However, what we do not often realize this was the beginning of Psalm 22, which Jesus probably knew by heart. The Psalm continues to describe in grueling detail what Jesus is experiencing, and yet the Psalm moves to this beautiful point:

But you, O Lord, do not be far away! O my help, come quickly to my aid! Deliver my soul from the

sword, my life from the power of the dog! Save me from the mouth of the lion! From the horns of the wild oxen you have rescued me. I will tell of your name to my brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you: ... From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him.

Jesus was thankful to God in even the worst situation imaginable. Many who passed him by that day did not realize that he was using the 22nd Psalm to say that he would be thankful to God in all situations.

Can we do the same? How easy it is to become angry with God, which is where Jesus started, but unlike our Lord we stay angry with God. Jesus started in anger and moved to thanksgiving. If Jesus could do this in the most difficult time possible, perhaps we can do this with what we face as well. There are a number of ways to face life and all its challenges, one is with indifference, another is anger, or the third can be in thanksgiving to God.

If we move to indifference, or anger our lives become either meaningless or miserable. Sadly, in my lifetime I have met many people who have done exactly that. However, as followers of Jesus we do not have to, and truly should not choose such a course. Rather we should open our hearts and thank the Lord for the love that God has for each of us.

In this season of Thanksgiving let us learn to live our lives in a depth of gratefulness and joy that can change the very being of who we are!

Zakhhil's family is still in Afghanistan. Thankfully they have not been affected by the earthquake which hit there recently, but they are still waiting for news on how to come to the US. I have attached a picture of his family when he left for the US. Of course, they are 2 years older now.



Behind the Scenes With the AV Team

Every Sunday—religiously (pun intended)—the sanctuary of First Presbyterian Church—Newark fills with sound. Spoken liturgies, hymns, sermons, anthems, and more, all combine to lift the congregation in praise and worship. At the same time, the sound and video are streamed over the internet to remote participants, as well as recorded for later viewing. This is made possible by the audio-visual (AV) team, who works each week to ensure that every word and musical note are heard and the video is on target and clear.

The team is made up of church member volunteers and one paid professional, who provides expert level sound mixing and engineering ability. Dave Evers oversees video operators and their training, while Jim Pierson-Perry oversees the audio side.

Work begins at 8 am every Sunday with initial set-up of the audio mixer, speakers, and all audio inputs. Depending on the service, anywhere from 10 to 22+ different audio sources (mics and musical instruments) will be used. Loudness settings are adjusted during rehearsal of the music team to ensure all parts are heard and fit

together well. Our audio professional Andre also crafts more advanced settings for each input's equalization, panning, compression, etc., as well as for the overall mix output, to ensure a consistent and pleasing sound.

Andre actually gets to do this twice: once for insanctuary sound and a separate mix for the livestream sound. This is because some sounds do not need mics within the sanctuary—e.g., organ—but must be properly miked and mixed for the livestream. In addition to these two mixes, our audio system also provides two extra, different mixes: one so that the choir can hear what is being said and a different mix to an assisted hearing system under the sanctuary floor that feeds spoken word audio to attendees with hearing aids.

Once the service starts, the audio and video operators follow the bulletin just like producing a live TV show. Individual audio inputs must be muted when not needed to avoid extraneous noises, then turned back on just before use.

The video operator controls four cameras to set up the best view for the next step in the service, then seam-lessly blends from one camera angle to another. The operator uses a controller with joystick and knobs to move each camera up down, left, right, and zoom in or out as needed. This is easy when someone is standing still but becomes tricky when tracking Pastor Eric as he walks about giving the sermon.

While the AV Team's primary work is to support Sunday worship services, it is also called upon to support other activities such as PW events in the sanctuary, weddings, and memorial services. In a recent example, a memorial service was livestreamed to family and friends as far away as Ireland who were not able to attend in person.

The AV Team is proud to help with worship service and other events. We have come a long way from early days back in Covid time when we would marry audio recordings with video from a single handheld camcorder. Our system today is pretty much state of the art. Please feel free to stop back to the AV control booth—after worship service—and see it for yourself!

The Newark Area Welfare Committee (NAWC) operates a food pantry out of the Newark United Methodist Church on main street. This food pantry is operated by the all-volunteer team at NAWC. The pantry is open all year round for one hour on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of each week. Each of the days the pantry is open a set of two volunteers typically provision between 3-9 individuals who have come to obtain food for their families. The volunteers help each visitor by stocking bags of food from the pantry's shelves, refrigerator, and freezer. The pantry is setup to allow our visitors to "shop" from our shelves of food and secure perishable food items from our refrigerator and freezer. NAWC's food pantry is USDA and Delaware Food Bank approved with food supplies chosen to include nutrient rich choices.

NAWC is inviting any interested persons to volunteer and help support the operation of our food pantry. Volunteering for 1 hour a month or more is welcomed and appreciated! Your help will allow us to continue making a difference. The food pantry has over the last 4 months provisioned food for 728 individuals and their families. We are making a difference and your support can continue that effort in our community!
